

Wapsie Valley FFA Bylaw 1

In the event that a person associated with the FFA Chapter would pass away or suffer a tragedy a policy has been set up regarding the procedures that are warranted. These have been approved by the FFA membership at the September 2004 FFA meeting and may be amended annually. Only one category will be in effect per situation.

- Present FFA members - \$100.00
- Parents of present members - \$50.00
- Past FFA members - \$50.00
- Honorary Members - \$50.00
- Parents or siblings of past members - \$25.00
- Staff of the Wapsie Valley School System - \$25.00
- FFA Supporters that are not in any other category-\$25.00

Wapsie Valley FFA Bylaw 2

The selection of students that attend activities and/or conventions are based upon the merit system we have established.

- For Conference selection:
 - Overall column will be used
- For National Conference selection:
 - Overall column will be used from this year and previous years as an FFA member. The merits will then be averaged based upon the following:
 - 1st year member--divided by 1
 - 2nd year member--divided by 1
 - 3rd year member--divided by 2
 - 4th year member--divided by 3
 - If a member has attended the conference before as a non-participant 100 points will be deducted.
 - the scores will then be placed in order with the highest points receiving the first right to attend.
- For Star Awards
 - Activity points column will be used
- For Star Leadership
 - Overall column will be used

Wapsie Valley FFA Bylaw 3

The senior scholarship is based upon the decision of a total of six people and the amount of merit points the individual has.

- 6 people breaks down into two groups
 1. Three community members: one from Readlyn, Fairbank, and Oran preferably.
 2. Three FFA members: one from Readlyn, Fairbank, and Oran
- The merit section is decided by the amount of overall merit points are earned.

Wapsie Valley FFA Bylaw 4

The senior scholarship will be supported, at least in part, from the Alumni Association and Stine Seed Sales when available. The amount allocated each year will be determined by the Friends of the Wapsie Valley FFA.

- All participating graduating FFA seniors will receive a scholarship as long as the parents and/or students are members of the Alumni Association.
- The merit system will be an instrumental part in determining the amount each student receives.
- The activity category of the merit system will be used.
- The amount allocated will be determined by the Friends of the Wapsie Valley FFA.

Wapsie Valley FFA Bylaw 5

The following guidelines will prevail for the merit trip.

- The merit trip will be determined by the top 15 merit winners from the year.
- The overall column of the merit system will be used.
- The place will be determined by the top 15 merit winners
- The time and place will be selected by the top 15 merit winners.
